Recipe Riches

Bacon, Egg, and Cheese Breakfast Bread

A perfect creation to cook for Mom on Mother's Day

Ingredients:

Cooking spray, for pan	Freshly ground black pepper
6 slices bacon	3 cans refrigerated biscuits (such as Pillsbury)
4 large eggs	1 1/2 c. Shredded Monterey Jack
1 1/2 c. skim milk	
Salt	

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350° and grease a Bundt pan with cooking spray. In a large skillet over medium heat, cook bacon until
2. crisp, 6 minutes. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate and let drain, then crumble.
3. In a large bowl, whisk together eggs and milk and season with salt and pepper.
4. Quarter biscuits and dip in egg mixture, then add a layer to the prepared bundt pan. Add a layer of cheese, then bacon, then continue with biscuit pieces until the pan is three-quarters full. Pour remaining egg mixture over top.
5. Bake until egg is cooked through and bread is golden, 35 to 37 minutes. Let cool, then turn out onto a plate and serve.
6. Optional step: Once you turn out bread, top with additional cheese, and return to oven until melted, 5 minutes.
